Festival, a fantastic achievement for SCWB. Our Christmas Concert in the Chapel at Royal Victoria Country Park was the most wonderful festive experience, supported on stage by the choir from Netley Abbey Junior School.

At the end of January, we organised our fifth Banding Together event with wind, brass and percussion musicians from far and wide joining us for a day of music-making under the inspirational guidance of virtuoso tuba player (and former SCWB guest soloist) Les Neish.



#### Tremendous trombone - and a Celtic calamity



In late March SCWB performed a concert in Turner Sims with guest soloist Brett Baker, Principal Trombone of the world-famous Black Dyke Band. At the heart of the programme was the *Pandora Trombone Concerto*, a hugely challenging contemporary concerto by Benjamin Ellin. The remainder of the programme revolved around music that fell into the category 'Best of British'. The one downside to this marvellous concert was the inescapable

obligation (a stipulation attached to a generous donation in our fundraising to buy timpani) for me to conduct the encore while wearing a Celtic football jersey. Those who know me will understand quite how much of a trial that was!

#### Jubilation at The Chapel, Royal Victoria Country Park

Most recently, we performed a two-hour programme of music to a large and enthusiastic crowd at the Royal Victoria Country Park Jubilee Lunch. Again, we dodged the rain!

We are extremely lucky to have as our guest soloist Chris Avison, until recently the Principal Trumpet of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra. He will be performing a classic of the repertoire, the *Denis Wright Cornet Concerto* as well as the more contemporary and hugely exciting *Excursions*, by Bruce Broughton. Aside from the solo items, Walton's *Crown Imperial* will be the finale, complemented by a splendidly inventive arrangement of the traditional folk song *Dashing Away with the Smoothing Iron* and *Breezin' Down Broadway* (the name says it all!). You'll have to come along to find out everything else that we'll be playing!

We will be giving our yearly concert on Romsey Bandstand in the War Memorial Park. Bring a picnic, a rug, but hopefully not an umbrella.
