(named after the first piece of the programme), Peter joined us for two amazing solo pieces, and a bonus encore. Another British premiere for SCWB with the virtuoso clarinettist Peter Cigleris performing Satoshi Yagisawa's Clarinet Concerto and a programme of music which looked set to provide a hugely successful and entertaining evening.

The concerto was new to me and as a clarinettist I was really looking forward to getting to know the music and more importantly to working with Peter and observing his craft.

From the first note I was captivated by Peter's performance of this wonderful and exciting piece of music.

The concerto was hugely challenging and Peter's performance was inspirational. He demonstrated amazing technical skills; the faster passages were executed perfectly and his warm rich tone sang out with the beautiful melody. He made it look effortless!



Peter's performance of the popular Introduction, Theme and Variations by Rossini was breath-taking. Again, his amazing technical skills, remarkable tonguing and beautiful tone were incredible. The encore, Blues – American in Paris, was the perfect end to the concert. We could have been in Ronnie Scott's!

For me, and I am biased, this concert was up there with the very best of SCWB performances. It was an honour and privilege to work with Peter and witness his incredible mastery of the clarinet. I do hope we have the opportunity to work with him again.

We also said a fond farewell to two longstanding and much respected members of SCWB. Simon (alto sax and deputy conductor) and Dawn (bassoon) have been with the band for 20 years, are

wonderfully talented musicians, lots of fun and will be very much missed! The good news is that we will be working with Simon and Dawn again in our joint concert with the Band of The Hampshire Constabulary in September.
